

2023/2024 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS AS TOLD BY OUR AUDIENCE

At Symphony San Jose, we care about the experience of our audience. That's why we created a season marked by experiences that surprise and delight, connecting patrons to the music and to each other.

Our pre-concert festivities included a beer garden, ballet dancers, and special guests, which fostered a sense of wonder and belonging among our community members. Our thrilling concerts were loved by newcomers and season subscribers.

How do we know? We asked! Our team conducted surveys for each concert, which averaged a 95% response rate with approximately 90% of respondents rating their experience as a four out of five or higher.

Our magical season opener conducted by the talented rising star Lidiya Yankovskaya charmed audiences. The concert was preceded by a themed Cinderella Ball which raised \$82,000 for our community and education programs.

Elfman, a four-time Oscar nominee best known for his work for 'The Simpsons' and 'Nightmare Before Christmas,' took questions from the audience and shared the stories behind composing his violin concerto, which later came to life in a stirring performance by soloist Sandy Cameron.

COMMUNITY AND EDUCATION PROGRAMS

Harmonizing Our Programs for Greater Impact

To share the transformative power of music with a wider audience and to foster a lifelong appreciation of symphonic music in young people, our team revitalized our community and education initiatives in 2023/24. We launched new pilot programs and revamped existing initiatives, staying true to our core values of education and equity.

MUSIC IN THE SCHOOLS: ENGAGING YOUNG MINDS WITH MUSIC

MUSIC WITHOUT BORDERS: SHARING THE HEALING POWER OF MUSIC

Our string quartet visited five San Jose public schools across four different Santa Clara County school districts to introduce elementary schools students to foundational music concepts and spark an interest in symphonic music. Our goal is to provide an "up close and personal" experience that captivates students, before inviting children to attend a full orchestral concert at the California Theatre in the following year.

There is nothing more effective than the experience of live music to connect with others or lift one's spirit. At Symphony San Jose, we want to share that experience widely. 'Music Without Borders' brings our music to communities who face barriers to attending our concerts. In its inaugural season, the program brought a string quartet to perform for children and families at Stanford Hospital's Ronald McDonald House and at two agedcare facilities. We also leveraged the program to promote our programs to new audiences at the NVIDIA and Microsoft headquarters.



MUSIC NOTES: GOING BEYOND THE SCORE

"I really enjoy the preconcert talks. The repartee between the conductor and the soloists makes them seem more relatable, wanting to share their joy in the music."

Attending the symphony for the first time can feel a little daunting. Questions about what to expect, when to clap, and the meaning behind the music can prevent patrons from getting the most out of a performance. Through 'Music Notes,' we work to demystify orchestral music and create a welcoming and informative atmosphere for audience members. Before each 'Classics at the California' concert, audience members have the opportunity to participate in an informal discussion designed to enrich their experience, including fun facts and interviews with special guests.

NEXTGEN SOUNDCHECK PASS: CULTIVATING THE NEXT GENERATION OF SYMPHONY LOVERS

"For just about \$4 a concert, my boyfriend and I saw every Symphony concert this year. Definitely the cheapest and best date in town!"




FUNDING THE MUSIC
